

Aston le Walls Produce Show 2019

Saturday, 7th September from 9am

The Aston le Walls Annual Produce show is your chance to show us your skills at cultivating, baking and handicrafts.

Yes, it's a competition, we have a team of proper judges and there are prizes for first, second and third places in each category but it's also fun, friendly and a great chance to stock your larder when we sell off the entries in the afternoon!

Whatever your skill, we have a way you can show it off, so have a look at the list of categories, decide which ones you are going to enter, fill in the form and follow the instructions below.

There's even a whole section for youngsters aged 14 and under (see back) and entry is free for them!

Timing: Entries (*entry fee 25p per 'adult' category*)

Once decided, tick the relevant rows in the entry form and either

1. Pop it in an envelope with your entry fee and drop it through the letterbox at Corner House, Butlers Close from Monday 2nd September. (*Make a note of the categories you're entering!*). OR
2. Bring it along to the Village Hall on Saturday between 9 and 10.30am, when you stage your entry.

There are four columns on the form, so you can share it with the family but, should you need more, you can download extra from the village web site: www.astonlewalls.org or the Facebook page

Timing: Saturday 7th September

- 9 am Hall opens for staging and last-minute entries
- 11am Hall closes for judging—all competitors to leave
- 2.30 pm Hall opens for viewing. Tea & coffee available
- 3.00 pm Prizes awarded
- 3.15 pm Auction of produce (if the exhibitor allows!)

Rules and recipes follow..

RULES

1. All flower & vegetable exhibits (except wildflowers) to have been grown by the exhibitors for at least 2 months.
2. Classes for fresh produce are for items that have not previously been shown elsewhere and exhibitors should note that any exhibit may be cut or sampled for examination at the discretion of the judges.
3. Only one entry per exhibitor per class is permitted.
4. Exhibits are shown at exhibitors' risk. The Village Hall shall not be liable for compensation or loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
5. The Judges' decision is binding and final.
6. Exhibiting at the Show implies an acceptance of these rules.
7. The Show is only open to residents of our Parish.

RECIPES

Victoria Sponge

- 3 hens eggs
- Equal weight of
 - Flour
 - Butter or margarine
 - Sugar
- 7" / 18cm tin
- Filling: raspberry jam
- Topping: caster sugar

Fruit Cake

- 8oz self raising flour
- 5oz demerara sugar
- 4oz soft margarine
- 12oz mixed fruit
- ¼ teaspoon nutmeg
- ¼ teaspoon spice
- ¼ teaspoon almond essence
- pinch of salt
- 2 eggs
- ¼ pint of milk.

Method

1. Combine all the ingredients in a mixing bowl.
2. Beat together for 4 to 5 minutes.
3. Bake in a greased & lined 8" / 20cm cake tin, below the centre of the oven, at 325°F, 160°C or Regulo 3, for 2 to 2 ½ hours.
5. Allow to cool in the tin.
